Headteacher's update ...

Welcome to the new school year. The summer holiday now seems a very long time ago as we approach the end of our first half-term.

As a school, the start of our year actually begins when our students receive their A Level and GCSE results. So many students celebrated personal successes and superb results, but also confirming university and apprenticeship places. So it is always an exciting day for everyone, but also a proud day for us as we wish our



students well as they secured university places from Bristol to Warwick, studying a variety of different subjects.

GCSE results day was equally exciting as so many students achieved so many good grades, with over a quarter achieving 9-7 in Maths and a fifth achieving 9-7 in English.

The start of the school year began as we welcomed the new Year 7 students to the school. They have all made a great start and we were very pleased to report to our Primary school colleagues how well they have all settled and are taking full advantage of the opportunities at The Radcliffe. I am particularly pleased to see how many Year 7 students have joined A2B, are involved in the school show, competed in House competitions and took part in Spooky Evening last week.

As ever, this half-term has been very busy as we welcomed parents of our Year 11 and Sixth Form students to an Information evening, giving valuable advice and guidance about the year ahead and how to support your child. The school's Open Day, where we invite parents to have a tour of the school during a normal working day, was particularly popular this year, as we welcomed over 100 parents into our school to see what happens in our classrooms. The excellent feedback we received as a result was very much appreciated by the staff team.

Open Evening for our prospective Year 7 students for next year was also held in the same week with many students helping out with tours and demonstrating activities in the classrooms. So many visiting parents commented on how polite and welcoming our students are and I would like to take this opportunity to thank all of the students involved throughout the evening.

As ever, our students represent our school in the many different activities they take part in, both in and outside of school from our Year 13 students involved in summer placements, Year 12 students success in the Debating competition to our school council attending MK Debate, there are so many reasons to be proud of our students, just some of which are showcased within this newsletter.

100 shiny new chairs arrived in our study area last week, smartening up the Sixth Form environment!

Over the first six weeks of term we're pleased to report that 33% of our students have achieved 100% attendance.

Year 12 v Year 13 football match took place on 9th October. A great effort put in by both teams - the Year 12 team claimed a 5-0 victory!

Radcliffe Sixth Form 'University Challenge' launches next term with Mrs Stapley-Jones as quizmaster. House teams will compete against each other over six rounds leading up to the final in the spring term.

The Sixth Form A2B advisors have delivered presentations on the development of Mental Health Community Garden to pupils in years 7-11. The garden is a student-led initiative to provide a safe, calm and supportive environment for any pupils needing to use it.

UCAS applications are well and truly underway with some students having received offers already. Our Year 13 students are preparing for their first set of mock examinations which take place over the two weeks after half term.

We will be taking all Year 12 students to the Safe Drive Stay Alive tour at The Ridgeway Centre on 29th November. This is an innovative theatre education project, exploring the circumstances and consequences of a road traffic collision.






Year 12 Visit to the BSI

Thanks to The British Standards Institute (BSI) and STEM Ambassador Hub East Midlands for the BSI Inspiration Day. BSI are the organisation that tests and assesses compliance with many industry standards in food, cyber security safety and medical equipment – you may have seen the Kitemark.

Seven Year 12 students attended the day with other local schools and met BSI representatives from Milton Keynes Offices, Hemel Hempstead Safety Laboratories, Madrid and Milan Offices including the UK and Ireland Managing Director . They got to network and discuss career entry and training with science and engineering technicians and managers, human resources, public relations, compliance and risk management, sales and client services staff. They took part in organoleptic testing of drinks, investigated the testing of various safety devices like helmets and saw how a cybersecurity expert simulates a malicious attack to check the security of a client's network.




Congratulations to the four year 13 Science and Mathematics students who completed a 4 week summer placement with local Universities on presenting their research at the Rothamstead Institute to other students, parents and local scientists and engineers; and receiving their Nuffield Awards. The students took part in a Nuffield funded placement at Cranfield University during the summer holidays. These placements allow students to run an independent undergraduate level project with University researchers and PhD students. Two biology students investigated if iron oxide nanoparticles could be used to deliver siRNA (small interfering ribonucleic acid) to tumour cells in order to supress cancer cell growth without the use of aggressive chemotherapy. While a mathematics and physics students worked in the jet propulsion engineering department and modelled the effect of using hybrid turboelectric engines in flight to discover how efficient these engines could be. The students have also entered their research for the Gold Crest Award.

Applications for Nuffield Placements are now open any year 12 science or mathematics students interested in applying should speak to Mr Taylor or Miss Cain for further details.

The first international competition of this academic year saw Radcliffe School in 10th place in the world rankings, with an amazing score of 404,825! For the first time ever, we had a Radcliffe student top the international leaderboard, so massive congratulations to Laiba Tahir with an incredible individual score of 129,640! Alice Bellamy was also in the global top 20, with a fantastic score of 52,925.

We had 165 students across all year groups competing this year, across 10 languages including Japanese, Italian, Urdu and Polish. Our top 25 participants are shown here. Well done all!


