## Creative Writing at Radcliffe



Stories with song lyrics in them? How about ones with lines from famous speeches? Ever started a story with the ending? Welcome to 'Writing Friday'!

Here in the English department we're unashamed fans of creative practices in the classroom. By that, we mean the following things: we value giving our student opportunities to explore language to help them develop curiosity about the way language works as well as providing them with new understandings and insights; we want them to have opportunities to express themselves freely in forms of their choice (as well as those we require of them), we want them to be able to offer original, thoughtful responses to a wide range of surprising stimuli; and we want them to be inspired by the creative writing that they read in books but also that of their peers.

Language and language learning is not just about creativity, of course; one of the key aspects of our subject for students to grasp is that often it is necessary to use language within particular constraints. But even working within constraints can be highly creative. For example, it is a real challenge to write in an established genre in ways that make it fresh and exciting.

That is why we are dedicating Fridays for this purpose. Our English books are now full of imaginative examples of our students creative minds and we would like to share the following with you:

*"Finally, the score stood at 20-19. My favour. One point away from victory. I resisted meeting Larry LaSalle's eyes. It was still his serve. Crouching, waiting, I finally looked at him, saw his narrowed eyes. They were suddenly inscrutable, mysterious. A shudder made me tremble, as I realised that he could easily win the next two points and take the championship away from me. - The Big Bang Fair saw a group of Year 7, 8 and 9 students attending at Birmingham NEC. The day was focused around STEM subjects (Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths) with a number of talks, shows, exhibitions and many hands on experiments. Initially the students were quite apprehensive about the day but by the time we returned to school were so enthused on the subject that they are eager to attend again next year.
- Maths club is continuing to take place at lunch time in M2 on a Thursday. The club has been well attended with an average of 15 students participating in a variety of activities from Maths games, to practice for the UKMT challenges and revision for tests and exams.
- The UKMT Team Challenge took place Friday 20 April. Well done to **Kieran O'Callaghan, Milan Neal, Alister Scott** and **Hayden Crook** who represented the school. This is the first year that Radcliffe School has participated in the UKMT Team Challenge and we won 3<sup>rd</sup> place at the Regional event held at Caroline Chisholm.
- The UKMT Junior Challenge takes place on Thursday 26 April in the morning and will include our top Year 8 with a few Year 7s being given the opportunity to experience this ahead of next year. We look forward to some brilliant results and will share these with you as soon as we can.

### ***Key Stage 4***

They competed against other schools in Milton Keynes in a challenging team competition testing their mathematical, team-working and communication skills. They performed really well and were commended for being the school that did consistently well in each of the three rounds (but not quite winning a round). The four students were **Sam Coffey, Peter Roder, Darcie Stimpson** and **Jessica Yeo**.

An example question is below:

Four people are travelling across country when they come to a river during the night. There is a narrow bridge, but unfortunately it can only hold two people at a time. They have only one torch and, because it's night, the torch has to be used when crossing the bridge. Ali can cross the bridge in one minute, Beth in two minutes, Carl in five minutes, and Dwayne in eight minutes. When two people cross the bridge together, they must move at the slower person's pace. The question is: can they all get across the bridge in 15 minutes or less? Describe the strategy which achieves your best time.

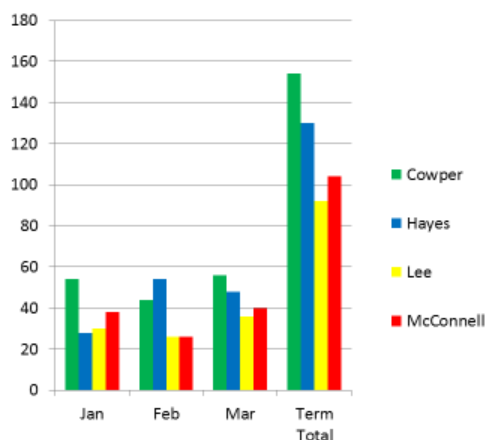

# Lee News



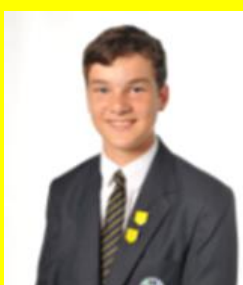

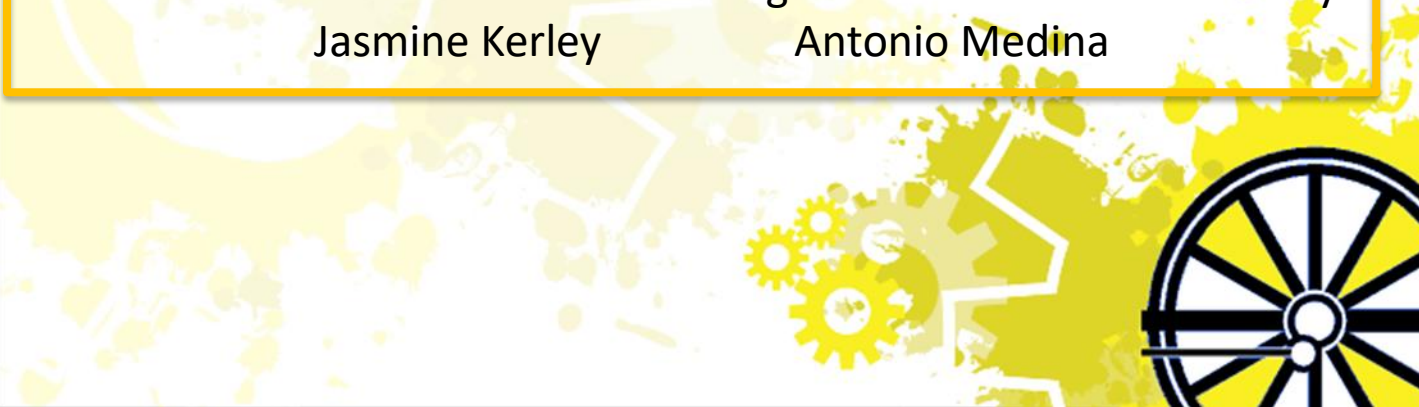

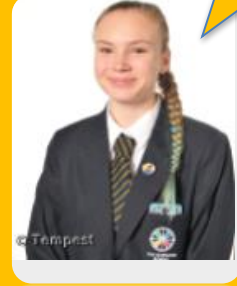
